

Articulation Agreement

The University of Michigan-Flint (Bachelor of Science in Radiation Therapy)
and
Washtenaw Community College (Radiography, Associate in Applied Science)

Purpose

The purpose of this articulation agreement is to provide an easy transition for Washtenaw Community College students transferring to the University of Michigan-Flint. The University of Michigan-Flint and Washtenaw Community College will maintain the integrity of their separate programs and enter into this agreement as cooperating institutions.

The University of Michigan-Flint and Washtenaw Community College agree that any student who successfully completes the course requirements as delineated in this agreement may transfer up to 62 semester hours toward the Bachelor of Science in Radiation Therapy offered through the School of Health Professions and Sciences.

The University of Michigan-Flint graduation requirements for students who follow this agreement assume completion of a total of at least 141 semester hours for the Bachelor of Science in Radiation Therapy, including those transferred from Washtenaw Community College, and completion of the required upper division courses.

This agreement does not guarantee acceptance into the University of Michigan-Flint Bachelor of Science in Radiation Therapy. Washtenaw Community College students will be considered on an equal basis with all other applicants provided they meet the prerequisites for admission to the Radiation Therapy Program as specified in the current University of Michigan-Flint catalog.

Degree requirements and policies for either institution are subject to change without the approval of the other institution; however, sufficient notice shall be given by the institution making the change to permit the other to make any adjustments necessary so that an appropriately amended articulation agreement or addendum can be prepared.

This agreement will become effective on the date of signing and shall remain in effect for three academic years, expiring on August 30, 2008. At that time, this agreement will automatically renew for another three academic years with appropriate addendums. Should either party wish to terminate this agreement, notification shall be given in writing at least ninety days prior to the effective date of termination.

Goals

- Encourage students to apply and enroll at the University of Michigan-Flint.
- Assist transfer students in the transition from the community college to the University of Michigan-Flint.
- Encourage an academic alliance between the University of Michigan-Flint and Washtenaw Community College through dialogue and interaction from both institutions.
- Increase retention of transfer students through enhanced advisement and closely articulated academic course work.
- Promote student academic preparation and transfer planning.
- Support and promote the value and benefits of community college transfer to obtain a bachelor's or higher academic degree.

Commitment by the University of Michigan-Flint

- Provide transfer-planning advisement regarding the University of Michigan-Flint admission and graduation requirements.
- Provide current transfer information to Washtenaw Community College.
- Invite faculty from Washtenaw Community College for curriculum and/or articulation-related forums hosted by the University of Michigan-Flint.
- Provide information to Washtenaw Community College faculty and students regarding academic and cultural events held on campus and encourage joint attendance.
- Develop periodic assessment tools that provide Washtenaw Community College and the University of Michigan-Flint with information about transfer student performance and satisfaction at the University of Michigan-Flint.

Commitment by Washtenaw Community College

- Encourage faculty and advisors of Washtenaw Community College to participate in faculty-to-faculty seminars and other academic activities with their University of Michigan-Flint counterparts.
- Encourage visits by Washtenaw Community College faculty, advisors and students to the University of Michigan-Flint and University of Michigan-Flint faculty and advisors to Washtenaw Community College.

Course Equivalencies for Bachelor of Science in Radiation Therapy The University of Michigan-Flint and Washtenaw Community College

The minimum requirements for transfer to the University of Michigan-Flint are either completion of at least 12 transferable credits with a gpa of 2.00 or higher, or completion of fewer than 12 transferable credits with a gpa of 2.70 or higher. Dual enrollment as a Guest Student is available to students who wish to begin taking University of Michigan-Flint requirements while still taking courses at Washtenaw Community College.

Attaining the minimum requirements does not guarantee admission to the University of Michigan-Flint.

The University of Michigan-Flint Bachelor of Science in Radiation Therapy Program will grant credit to the transfer student for successful completion of Washtenaw Community College courses as identified below:

Additional courses can be transferred from Washtenaw Community College: one course in Fine Arts; and one course in Humanities/Values Inquiry (covers both areas). Options for both of these can be found in the UM-Flint transfer guide. Some examples are Humanities: ART 143, 150, COM 101 many ENG courses and HUM courses, PHO 103, DAN 180, HSC 244, MUS 207; Value Inquiries courses: PLS 112, PSY 209, and SOC 205.

Some additional courses will need to be completed at UM-Flint. Two Health Care courses (6 Cr) will need to be taken at UM-Flint prior to being admitted to the RTT program in the fall semester. These courses are HCR 300 and 362. Students need to plan accordingly so that these courses will be completed prior to the fall semester that the student plans on entering the program.

These requirements and equivalencies are subject to change. Sufficient notice will be given to permit necessary adjustments whenever possible. The most current information is available from the UM-Flint Catalog, web site or academic department.
