## History Resource Center U.S

### (An Online Research Database)

History Resource Center U.S. database provides full text of reference book articles, magazine and journal articles, and newspaper articles and also provides text and/or images of primary source documents and maps. In addition, it provides audio and video clips. The most generally useful search starts with an Advanced Search and uses one of these index types: full text, keyword, subject. (Other index types are person, title/headline, source, and author.) The user types a search term such as confederate army and then chooses from among the resulting categories. Alternatively, the user can specify primary documents or other categories initially.

While History Resource Center U.S. is a quick source of full text magazine, journal, and newspaper articles, its most distinctive features are the primary documents, maps, and multimedia. Some of the primary documents are transcripts only while others are images of the original historical documents found in special collections at research libraries or museums. Choosing a primary document will also bring up a commentary by a modern day historian that explains the document author's perspective at the time of writing.

Audio clips in History Resource Center U.S. range from segments of interviews on National Public Radio to readings of documents or reenactments of older events. The 55 video clips in the collection are watchable through QuickTime software and include footage of twentieth century presidential visits, protest demonstrations, and footage of events such as the Berlin airlift.
